City of Hallandale Beach Hallandale Lift Station No. 3

We are currently installing the new conduits and electrical wiring. We are approximately 80% complete and anticipate system startup in the upcoming weeks.



City of North Miami Beach Bunche Park

All the watermain is installed pending health department clearance to make all final connections pending mill and overlay and final restoration



City of Hallandale Pump Station No. 6

We currently have installed the temporary by-pass pumps and electrical drops and completed all fusing of the HDPE pipe, set the by-pass vault and tapped the existing force main.
